

JOHN STEWART: A RETROSPECTIVE

Often regarded as one of the most versatile photographers working today, John Stewart's career began in the early

1950s, when his first portrait work resulted from a meeting with Picasso – he was granted a request to photograph the artist and his friend Henri Matisse. Stewart's work is now in museums and collections around the world. Many of his photographs are developed using the Fresson process, which generates an image that is distinctively charged and reminiscent of the 'pointillism' in Impressionist painting – a style very appropriate to the intensity of Stewart's observation. Haunch of Venison London presents the first UK solo exhibition of award-winning Belgian artist and filmmaker Nicolas Provost. Provost investigates the boundaries of fiction and reality by filming everyday life with a hidden high resolution camera, turning the cinematic images into a fiction film by using cinematographic and narrative codes from the Hollywood film language.
